Courses Approved for Certification of IGETC for Transfer to California State University and University of California AUGUST 2006 - JULY 2007 ONLY

Completion of all the requirements in the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) will permit a student to transfer from a community college to a campus in either the California State University or the University of California system (generally in those majors at the UC campus which are included in those offered in the College of Letters and Science) without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division, general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements.

Check with your counselor or the UC campus which you plan to attend to determine if you may use IGETC or if you must follow the campus specific requirements for your particular major. IGETC is generally not advisable for transfer students preparing for engineering and high unit science majors. There may be some limitations on transferable credit, particularly with UC. Check www.assist.org, UC Transferable Courses, for more information on credit limitations.

The course requirements for ALL AREAS must be completed before IGETC can be certified. ALL courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. While some courses are listed in more than one area, they can be certified for ONE only.
