The College grants the degrees of Associate in Arts and Associate in Science and the Bachelor of Science degree in approved disciplines to those students who have completed the subject requirements for graduation and who have maintained a 2.0 grade point average in subjects attempted. Students must also complete the general education, residence, and competency requirements set forth in Title 5 regulations.

Students may be awarded a Certificate of Achievement upon successful completion of a minimum of 16 or more semester units of degree-applicable coursework designed as a pattern of learning experiences designed to develop certain capabilities that may be oriented to career or general education.

The College grants other awards and certificates in accordance with provisions as set forth in the City College of San Francisco Catalog. The College is authorized to issue high school diplomas of graduation to adults 18 years of age or older who have fulfilled the applicable requirements. The College cooperates with the designated state agencies in the issuance of high school equivalency certificates and otherwise issues certificates of attendance in accordance with College rules and regulations.

The Chancellor shall establish procedures to determine degree and certificate requirements that include appropriate involvement of the local curriculum committee. The procedures shall ensure that graduation requirements are published in College catalogs and included in other resources that are convenient for students.
