ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
Capella University and City College of San Francisco

This agreement has as its sole purpose the establishment of a relationship of mutual benefit between City College of San Francisco and Capella University in order to make baccalaureate and graduate degree programs available to faculty, staff and graduates of City College of San Francisco.

This agreement identifies the City College of San Francisco (CCSF) courses that Capella University (CU) will accept in fulfillment of curricular requirements towards CU's baccalaureate degree programs. The agreement is based on the 2010-2011 CCSF and CU catalogs.

This agreement includes a Course-to-Course articulation agreement between City College of San Francisco and Capella University, which is intended to allow holders of City College of San Francisco credits to transfer approved credit hours into a Capella University program of study. Learners must complete a minimum of 50 percent of their core and specialization courses at Capella University. Students from City College of San Francisco must meet all other admission criteria documented in the current Capella University catalog.

As part of the articulation agreement, eligible CCSF faculty, staff, transfer students and graduates will receive a 10% tuition reduction on all Capella courses, excluding fees, beginning with the date of this agreement as long as the agreement is in effect. The tuition discount is not retroactive. Capella will provide a welcome page specifically for CCSF faculty, staff and graduates on the Capella website (www.capella.edu/ccsf) where the articulation will be posted.

Capella will provide marketing assistance, transfer materials, literature and other information to City College of San Francisco to support its efforts in promoting continued education and when possible, Capella will participate in transfer fairs, graduates events and faculty/staff development opportunities. Likewise, City College of San Francisco will distribute and/or make available updated degree and transfer information from Capella University to its learners via their transfer or career center.

Credit Accepted Toward the Baccalaureate Degree

CU will accept all CCSF courses designated in the CCSF catalog as baccalaureate level / California State University (CSU)-transferable toward the total number of units required for a CU baccalaureate degree. A maximum of 132 lower division quarter units (or 88 semester units) may be transferred from community college for this purpose. Each course accepted in transfer must be passed with a grade of "C" or better. Transfer students must complete a minimum of 48 quarter units of upper division coursework to meet CU graduation requirements.

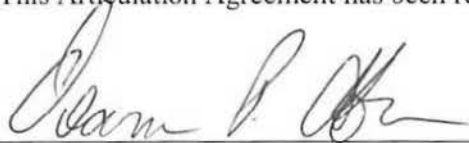

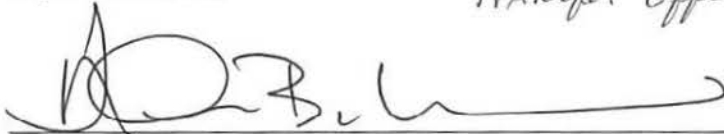
