Draft Resolution: Updated language on SLOs for the Faculty Handbook

Whereas assessment of student learning outcomes (SLOs) is a faculty responsibility, and faculty participation in assessment of student service outcomes (SSOs) and SLOs at diverse levels (section, course, program, department, GE area, institution) is essential to the college's success;

Whereas assessment of student learning outcomes (SLOs) is a faculty responsibility, and faculty participation in assessment of student service outcomes (SSOs) and SLOs at diverse levels (section, course, program, department, GE area, institution) is essential to the college's success;

Whereas the SLO Coordination Team has written updated language on SLO assessment for the Faculty Handbook and the SLO Committee has reviewed and approved that language on April 8, 2022;

Be it resolved that the attached language be endorsed by the Academic Senate for inclusion in the updated Faculty Handbook.

(attached language): Outcomes & Assessment Overview Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) are concise statements about the knowledge, skills, abilities, and attitudes that a student is expected to attain through courses, programs, or paths of study at City College. Outcomes are developed and assessed at the following levels: course, program, general education, and institutional. Student service outcomes (for services provided to students, such as counseling and library services) are also identified and assessed by faculty members. City College strives to create a culture where outcomes assessment continually improves the quality of student learning and institutional effectiveness. Members of each department and program engage one another in the development and assessment of outcomes. Cumulative course section-level (CRN) SLO data inform course and program revision. Collaboration among departments and programs is actively encouraged, with ongoing dialogue driving improvement efforts to meet the evolving needs of our diverse student population across instruction, curricula, programs, and support services. Institutional Learning Outcomes (ILOs) and General Education SLOs (GELOs) are listed in the College Catalog. Program SLOs are also found in the College Catalog under the program description. Course-level SLOs are found in the Course Outline of Record and in the Course Schedule. Faculty Responsibility for Courses & Programs All CCSF faculty are required to participate in assessment of student learning outcomes. For instructors teaching courses in each semester: SLOs must be provided to the student in the syllabus exactly as they appear in the official Course Outline of Record (see Section 4.7 Introductory Information for details of the written class information to give each student.) SLOs must be explained to the students, ensuring clarity and understanding. At least one course outcome must be assessed and reported on each semester for each course section-level (CRN) course taught. More broadly: All course outcomes are assessed at least once every six years, as stated in the CCSF Institutional Assessment Plan. Faculty are required to conduct aggregate assessments (comprehensive analysis of all student learning outcomes in a course or program) within an 18-month period prior to course or program renewal or modification. Institutional level Assessments SLO Coordinators are responsible for coordinating institutional level assessments for GELO and ILOs and sharing the results with the CCSF community. Faculty Support Assistance for outcomes assessment is provided by faculty designated as SLO Coordinators through weekly drop-in hours and FLEX day activities.
